#### **Background**

The present poll aimed to find out French citizens' views about the importance of preserving a healthy ocean and how they feel about current fishing quota allocation practices and criteria and if they would support or not more quotas to fleets with a lower environmental impact and offering more societal benefits for coastal communities.

#### **Objectives**

#### The study focused around 4 main objectives:

- 1) Do French citizens care about the marine environment and want it to be in a better state?
- 2) Do they think that the impact of the fishing boat on the ocean and the amount of jobs the boat creates are important factors to consider when allocating fishing quotas to fishers?
- 3) Do French citizens think that certain fishers should get more quotas over others, and if so, what factors are important?
- 4) Do they want their government to grant them more access to information on how they distribute fishing quotas to their fleets?

Men and women, of legal age (18+), residents








National Representative data, with gender & age quota



#### **KEY HIGHLIGHTS**

• The vast majority of French citizens believe that the government should give more quotas to small-scale fishers (86%) and fewer to industrial vessels (85%) to better support coastal communities and local economies.

- Citizens support such a re-distribution of quotas because it would support local seafood, protect jobs and protect the ocean.
- 83% of French citizens want their government to provide easier access to clear information about the criteria, methodology, and decisions regarding fishing quota distribution. 83% of French citizens also believe that small-scale fishers should have a greater role in decision-making regarding government quota distribution.
- The overwhelming majority (96%) of French citizens believe it is important to protect the ocean, with 66% considering it essential.
- 90% of French citizens also acknowledge that small-scale traditional fishing is more compatible with a healthy ocean while 86% consider unselective and destructive fishing methods like bottom trawling to be incompatible with preserving the ocean's health.
- 83% believe that the impact of fishing boats on ocean habitats and the amount of unwanted fish caught should be prioritized when
  distributing fishing quotas and 65% believe that the amount of jobs the boat creates and the importance of the fishing activity for
  the coastal community should also be a priority.


# 96% OF FRENCH CITIZENS THINK IT'S IMPORTANT TO PROTECT THE OCEAN, and 66% would even say it's essential

# 90% of French citizens think that small-scale fishing is more compatible with a healthy ocean than industrial fishing.




To what extent do you agree or disagree that small-scale fishing is more compatible with a healthy ocean than industrial fishing, like bottom trawling?

To what extent do you agree or disagree that destructive and unselective fishing methods, like bottom trawling, are incompatible with preserving a healthy ocean?








Do you agree or disagree that the French government should give more quotas to small-scale fishers to better support coastal communities and local economies?

Do you agree or disagree that the French government should give fewer quotas to industrial vessels, like bottom trawlers to better support coastal communities and local economies?




### Providing local seafood, protecting local jobs, and protecting the ocean are reasons why the vast majority of French citizens support more quotas for small-scale fishers.



Concerning redistributing quotas in favour of small-scale fishers, to what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements? Base (1015)



#### Most French citizens believe that the way the government gives out fishing quotas is not fair




